Whether you're taking Fifi to Paris or the neighborhood vet, you'll want to make sure she has her passport.

No, it's not some new State Department requirement. This passport — the Wag'N Pet Passport — is a handy booklet for keeping vaccination records, microchip numbers, medications and other useful information.

Every time your pet gets a vaccination, have your vet put the information in the passport.

Most pet-service providers — such as kennels, groomers and pet-walking companies — want this information, as do airlines when you send your pooch or kitty by air.

Passports are available for dogs, cats and ferrets. They are \$10.95 each at wagn4u.com.

Before starting a trip, research your destination's requirements for admitting a pet. Some destinations may not allow pets.
